

### Program Outcomes Report: School Counseling

Last year there were 13 graduates of Plymouth State University's School Counseling master's degree program. While 2013 school counseling students were not required to take an examination in order to become licensed, more than half them voluntary took the National Counselor Exam (NCE). The pass rate among these students was 86%. Beginning in 2014, student pass rate data on the Counselor Professional Competency Exam (CPCE) will be available. Over the past several years, 71 % of admitted students successfully completed the program. Among all program graduates (including those not actively seeking employment), the 10 year job placement rate (2004-2013) is 83%; the three year placement rate (2010-2013) is 72%.

For the current academic year, approximately 45 students are enrolled in the program. About half are full time and half are part-time. Course schedules accommodate both groups of students equally well.

### Program Outcomes Report: Mental Health Counseling

Last year there were 4 graduates of the Plymouth State University's mental health counseling master's degree program. No data exists regarding pass rates on licensing exams for this group as they are ineligible for licensure until accumulating 3000 hours of post master's experience and 100 hours of face-to-face supervision—which takes at least two years. To the best of our knowledge, 100% of our graduates who have taken the state licensing exam have passed it. Beginning in 2014, student pass rate data on the Counselor Professional Competency Exam (CPCE) will be available. Over the past several years, 68% of admitted students successfully completed the program. Among all program graduates, the three year placement rate (2010-2013) is 88%.

For the current academic year, approximately 36 students are enrolled in the program. About half are full time and half are part-time. Course schedules accommodate both groups of students equally well.
