YOUNG WRITERS CAMPS

The Plymouth Writing Project, a site of the National Writing Project, is dedicated to improving the teaching of writing in our nation's schools. For the past five years we have offered a summer institute for the best teachers of writing in the state. This year, for the fourth time, we will be offering camps for young writers.

About the Camps:

Summer writing camps for children and youth currently in grades 3-8 are sponsored by the Plymouth Writing Project.

Children and youth who attend camp will write in journals, write poetry, work with professional authors and illustrators, write on computers, and publish their writing. They will enjoy the opportunity to be part of a community of writers. Summer Youth Writing Project programs are planned and staffed by Plymouth Writing Project Teacher Consultants.

THREE SESSIONS AVAILABLE:

Nature Writing...What better way to inspire your writing than to explore your natural surroundings. We will be "field tripping" to various spots around campus to enjoy what nature has to offer. Bag lunch required. Note special time: 9am-2pm. Students entering grades 8-9

June 30-July 3, 2007 (note 4 day week)

Fiction ...Creativity is the name of the game at this camp! Use your imagination to enter a world of fantastic fictional fun. You'll learn that your ideas and ingenuity are virtually endless. Students entering grades 4-5

July 7-12, 2007

Poetry and Prose... Don't think you are a poet? It's okay. Come find the secret to the world of poetry and explore your inner writer. Students entering grades 6-7

July 14-18, 2007

Unless stated otherwise, sessions will be held on the Plymouth State University Campus and will run Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon
