Students must take a foreign language which will satisfy the **Global** Perspective. **Scientific** Perspectives must be completed by either taking courses in 2 different disciplines and taking a **S-Lab** with 1 of those courses, or by taking 2 consecutive semesters of lecture and 1 semester of lab in a year-long science course. **Social and Psychological** Perspectives must be completed in 2 different disciplines. Neither the **Writing** course nor the **Integrative** Component can be satisfied with transfer credit; they must be taken at Plymouth.
