*Students who have had significant Latin must take Intermediate Latin (LA2030-2040). Courses chosen to fulfill Groups I-IV must account for a minimum of 9 credits at 3000/4000 level. Students must take a foreign language in addition to Latin which will satisfy the **Global** Perspective. **Scientific** Perspectives must be completed by either taking courses in 2 different disciplines and taking a **SLAB** with 1 of those courses, or by taking 2 consecutive semesters of lecture and 1 semester of lab in a year-long science course. **Social and Psychological** Perspectives must be completed in 2 different disciplines. **Upper-division/Academic Minor** requirement is met if the student either completes a minor or takes nine 3000-4000 level credits which may be courses from Groups I-IV not used towards the major.
