



ARE YOU DRIVING IN NEW HAMPSHIRE? Here are some important reminders:

- If you have a driver's license from your home country, you will need BOTH the license AND an international driving permit in order to legally drive in NH. You may drive with these 2 documents for up to 60 days in NH.
- If you do NOT have a driver's license from your home country, you MUST enroll and pass an approved drivers education course before applying for a NH driver's license.
- If you will be living in NH for MORE than 60 days and will be driving, you must obtain a NH driver's license.
- When applying for a NH driver's license, you may only apply at the CONCORD, NH DMV office. (Road tests may be taken at any location, however.)
- If you own a car, you MUST have car insurance.
