Updating your FAFSA If you have not yet updated your FAFSA with actual 2011 IRS tax information, log into your FAFSA and select "Make FAFSA Corrections". Click on the Financial Information tab and change the status of your 2011 IRS income tax return to "already completed". You, or your parent, will then be asked if you want to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool. This tool will electronically transfer processed IRS data into your FAFSA and will also satisfy the PSU tax transcript requirement (if it was requested). After transferring the data, do not forget to **e-sign** and **submit** the FAFSA!

Is the Financial Aid Team seeking a requirement called an IRS Tax Transcript?


If you are not able to update the FAFSA using the above IRS Data Retrieval Tool, an IRS Tax Return Transcript may be requested from the IRS after they process your return. This form includes most line items from your IRS income tax return as it was processed by the IRS. If the tax transcript is required, the instructions to obtain a tax transcript are posted on your myPlymouth account.
