Plymouth State University CURRICULUM PLANNING GUIDE with APPLICATION of TRANSFER CREDIT

WMCC students coming to PSU must have grades of C or better in their courses and a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA in order to transfer into the PSU BA in Criminal Justice.

WMCC students who have completed the AS degree in Criminal Justice/Homeland Security with one course with a grade of C- or below, may retake that course during the summer preceding entrance to PSU and still be accepted at PSU under this agreement, if she/he earns a grade of C or higher.

WMCC students who complete the AS degree in Criminal Justice/Homeland Security will need to take at least three more General Education classes (Creative Thought Direction, Scientific Inquiry Direction, Wellness Connection) and the foreign language requirement at PSU, along with the third and fourth year coursework for the BA Criminal Justice major. Advisors at WMCC will work with students to make sure that their General Elective, Mathematics and Science courses will transfer in as a Direction course and Mathematics Foundations at PSU.

If a WMCC student has not completed the AS degree in Criminal Justice/Homeland Security, then courses will be transferred in on a course-by-course basis.

The maximum number of transfer credits that can be applied to a PSU bachelor degree is 90.

For all students, at least 50 percent of the total course work for the major must be at the 3000/4000 level. The Department of Criminal Justice does not award course credit for life experience or training.

The foreign language requirement for all BA degrees calls for 0-8 credits: one year of one language (6-8 credits); **or** one 3000/4000 level world language course (3 credits); **or** being a native speaker of a language other than English (zero credit). American Sign Language I and II fulfill this requirement; however, American Sign Language does **not** satisfy the Global Awareness Connection.
