Financial Aid regulations assume that the family has primary responsibility for meeting the educational costs of students. Dependent students are required by law to provide parental information and signatures on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) to be considered for financial aid. If you are considered a dependent student according to the Federal financial aid definition, your aid eligibility is determined by using parental income and asset information in addition to your income and asset information.

Under the Federal definition to be considered independent for financial aid purposes for 2022-2023, you must meet at least one of the following conditions:

- You were born before January 1, 1999.
- You were a ward of the court since age 13, or both parents are deceased.
- You are a veteran of the US Armed Forces or on active duty (not training).
- You are married.
- You have a legal dependent other than a spouse for whom you provide at least 51% of their support.
- You are enrolled in a graduate or professional program.
- You are or were an emancipated minor as determined by court.
- You are or were in legal guardianship as determined by court.
- You were determined to be an accompanied youth who was homeless since July 1, 2021 by your high school or school district homeless liaison, or the director of an emergency shelter or transitional housing program funded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, or the director of a runaway or homeless youth basic center or transitional living program.

If there are extraordinary circumstances that you believe may warrant re-evaluation of your dependency status, please complete this form and document why you should be considered for a waiver of federal regulations requiring parental information.

## **Examples of possible eligible circumstances include:**

- Severe long-term estrangement from parents
- An unsafe domestic environment
- Unknown whereabouts of parents
- Incarcerated Parent(s)

## **Examples of non-eligible circumstances include:**

- You are not claimed as a federal income tax exemption on your parents' income tax return
- Financial hardship
- Parent(s) desire NOT to provide financial support for college or living expenses
- Unwillingness of your parent(s) to provide parental data to complete the FAFSA
- Your ability or desire to be self-sufficient
- You don't live with your parent(s)
