Nonresident Alien A person who is not a citizen or national of the United

States and who is in this country on a visa or temporary

basis.

Race & Ethnicity Self-reported category used to describe groups to which


individuals belong, identify with or belong in the eyes of the community. The categories do not denote scientific definitions of anthropological origins. A person may be

Yield Rate The percentage of admitted students who enrolled.






AdmissionsFirst-Time, First-Year Students, Admit Rate




Admissions Transfer Students Admit Rate






