The Certificate program in Early Intervention is primarily intended for professionals working in the field of family-centered supports and services (early intervention) who need more focused coursework related to infants, toddlers, and young children with disabilities. The Certificate does **not** lead to credentialing as an Early Interventionist, but does address many of the competencies needed for this credential.

Students in the Certificate program are eligible for federal financial aid. Up to two courses can be accepted for transfer credit in this Certificate.

The Certificate can be completed within three semesters, as follows:

- Spring (1<sup>st</sup> semester): ER 2300 Young Children's Development and Learning  
ERSE 3600 Infant and Toddler Care and Education
- Fall (2<sup>nd</sup> semester): ERSE 2500 Supporting Young Children with Exceptional Learning Needs  
ERSE 3100 Early Intervention
- Spring (3<sup>rd</sup> semester): ERSE 3300 Assessment and Evaluation in Early Intervention
