Students must complete all First Year Experience courses, all Directions courses, pass the Praxis and have a 2.50 GPA and an up-to-date electronic portfolio, **before** being accepted into the Clusters. The Clusters would begin in the second half of the junior year and would be taken three semesters in succession.

Elementary Student Teaching requires a minimum cumulative PSU grade point average of 2.70.

Students must take the Praxis I exam prior to admission to PSU and must successfully complete the exam before graduation from the two-year institution. Students shall also submit their Praxis I results to Plymouth.

Students with the AA degree in Teacher Preparation must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.50.
